Fantastic Landscapes: Beyond the Ordinary


Until March 22, 2026


Until May 3, 2026

At the heart of this exhibition is “NansiRoachy”, a multimedia sculpture created by artist Debbie Ebanks. It is inspired by Anansi, a famous spider from West African folklore, known for teaching lessons through storytelling. The artwork brings together old documents, video, and sculpture to collect stories and memories from the Jamaican community. Visitors are invited to explore new ways of sharing and experiencing these stories.



Sikh Heritage Month 2026

April 4 to 30, 2026

In partnership with the Sikh Heritage Month Foundation, PAMA presents the exhibition, *Baaghi Ja Badshah*. Discover the historical phases of Sikh life in which the community has stood as both baaghi (rebels) and badshah (leaders) and worked toward Halemi Raj, a vision of fair and ethical rule. Admission to PAMA is free during the month of April, courtesy of the Sikh Foundation of Canada.

Fantastic Landscapes: Collaging Workshop

PAMA has partnered with the Brampton Library to offer a creative workshop that invites you to design your own fantastic landscape inspired by PAMA's *Fantastic Landscapes: Beyond the Ordinary* exhibition. After a tour of the exhibition, explore composition, texture, and layering techniques to create unique, expressive pieces. Perfect for all skill levels, this session encourages creativity and personal expression by reimagining natural scenes to create vibrant, one-of-a-kind collage artworks. This program will take place at PAMA and is suitable for ages 14 and older.

Join Brampton-based artist Amye St. John for a hands-on cyanotype printmaking workshop inspired by the exhibition *PAMA Collects: Connections Between Us*. Drawing inspiration from everyday objects and personal histories featured in the show, explore how items shape our understanding of community and identity. Amye will guide you through the basics of the cyanotype process, helping you create unique, blue-toned prints that captures an object of your interest. No prior experience is necessary.

A Day of Creativity and Culture with Blkline

Join us for a day of creativity and culture. Blkline is a collective that empowers BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour) creators by amplifying their voices and connecting them to opportunities in the creative industries. They champion honest storytelling, break down barriers, and work toward a more inclusive creative landscape to build a space where artists can meet, share ideas, and grow a community that Canada has yet to see.

Led by multidisciplinary artist Debbie Ebanks, participants in PAMA's exhibition, *the stories we share are the light we carry*, will engage in an important discussion about cultural memory and how knowledge is passed down through generations in Black communities. The discussion will focus on the importance of community records, the ways individuals protect their histories, and what to consider when donating to archives. The event will be held at PAMA, in partnership with the Brampton Library.
