Kimutsik

In collaboration with CONTACT Photography Festival, PAMA showcases Glenn Gear's *Kimutsik* (dog team), 2023, portraying untethered dogs running freely against a backdrop of artistically crafted beadwork. Based on the film of the same title, this work recalls the tragic history of Inuit-owned dogs during government-enforced settlements.

Apple a Day

Nov. 21, 2024 - March 30, 2025

Brampton-based artist Meegan Lim's *Apple a Day* draws attention to food insecurity in today's economic reality of high inflation and rising costs of living. Reminiscent of the fairytale of *Jack and the Beanstalk*, her colourful illustration of people competing to climb a massive, tall tree crowned by an encased golden apple demonstrates life's constant struggle to reach the top of the metaphorical financial ladder.
